FINANCIAL UPDATE FOR THE CORPORATION

The Parking Lot Deal is a DONE Deal! – As you may know, the Arlington Public Schools (APS) has started the 5 year, \$100 million renovation of the Yorktown High School with their contractor, Hess Construction. One hurdle that APS had to overcome prior to beginning was to address the off street parking for the construction workers vehicles. Many sites were looked at, including ours. We began discussions with APS in March 2008. After a very long process, we were able to hammer out a deal. The agreement was to be between us and the General Contractor, not the School. There was a lot of time put into face to face meetings, telephone conference calls, and 5 revisions to the original agreement from March until December 2008. Finally an executed agreement was put into place in February 2009.

I would like to thank Brother Knight Colin Uckert who, with his law firm's blessing, did all the legal work on a pro-bono basis. If not for Colin's willingness, patience, and forward thinking, this deal would not have come to fruition. Let's just say that if not for Colin, we would have spent well over \$60,000 in legal fees to get this done, and I am not sure with the same result. Working with Colin, I always felt confident that he was protecting our interest, he would make a fair deal happen, and that he would never compromise our interest as the dollars were on the table. There was no prototype document off the shelf, he created it!

Hess Construction will be allowed to use a certain area of the lower parking for the parking of their workers personal vehicles from 6am to 4pm, Monday through Friday from January to the second week in June and then pickup again the last week in August through December. During the summer they will use the Yorktown HS lots since the school will be out.

The value of the deal was \$240,000; however they started 2 months early (March 2009) so the deal is now worth \$248,000. The rent is paid on a monthly basis. These funds will not be comingled with the operations of the corporation (nor will they be on the annual budget as income) as they are being deposited into a separate account entitled "Reserves" as that is what they are intended to be!

There where several key people involved in this success story who added different expertise. I would like to thank - Mike Kearny, Dave Padua, Frank White, Sandy Moore, Tom Hazzard, Jesse Corning, the Board of Directors, and again the big man Colin. And last, our good friend at APS, Bill O'Connor, who is the Director of Design and Construction. He kept the the process on track. Thanks Bill for this great opportunity. Oh by the way, Bill is also a Brother Knight from NY!

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE AND NEW CHAIRMAN NEEDED

In 2005, the Columbus Club faced a huge task - how to finance capital improvements that had been identified throughout the campus? These capital improvements were determined to be both costly and critical. After much debate and research, the Columbus Club decided to take on a loan and at the same time launched a Capital Campaign. Then I started asking people "Who do we tap for the chairmanship to work with me?" One night at the Council home, Susan Walthall approached me and said "The man for the job is Jim (Jimmy) Savarese". I said, "Well that's great, however who is he?" She pointed out the man at the bar holding court. I approached Jim, I introduced myself, asked him, and Jim said "Sure, no problem" From then on I worked very closely with Jim. I grew to learn what a great guy and motivator he was. I always told Jim that he was our Councils' Jimmy "V" (Jimmy Valvano). Through Jim and his group, the total raised to date is well over \$145,000 from our council's members (the first deposit was on 6-6-2006 for \$600). Thanks Jim for all your work, speeches, and jokes. We miss you brother!

To date, we have completed 26 projects at a cost of over \$356,000. The balance in CCF as of 3-30-2009 is \$28,872.

We are in the process of considering further Capital improvements in Phase III. Some of the improvements under consideration are: a new roof on the Main Hall, complete renovation of the pools, new deck addition at the pool, complete renovation of the lower lounge. The preliminary estimated cost may exceed \$375,000.

Number three is, you should have your emotions moved to tears, could be happiness or joy. But think about it. If you laugh, you think, and you cry, that's a full day. That's a heck of a day. You do that seven days a week, you're going to have something special.....

I know, I gotta go, I gotta go, and I got one last thing and I said it before, and I want to say it again. Cancer can take away all my physical abilities. It cannot touch my mind, it cannot touch my heart and it cannot touch my soul. And those three things are going to carry on forever. "






