SNACK BAR/CONCESSION STAND AND CLARKE'S LOUNGE 2010 SUMMER SEASON REPORT

In May, 1999 Bob Clarke was asked to fill in as "temporary" manager for the snack bar/concession stand/pool lounge. Since then, summer after summer, Bob has worked very hard to improve the quality of the food, service and the overall atmosphere of those establishments for the enjoyment of our members, guests and the pool patrons. What a success it has been! Some facts about those facilities:

- Open seven days a week, the grill is open daily noon to 8:00 PM, the lounge from noon until 9:00ish. Bob is in every day at 7:00AM.
- During the camp season they prepare between 70 and 90 pre-arranged lunches in styrofoam containers for the campers.
- There are 50 young people working per week in various shifts whom Bob supervises.
- 20 different beers are served along with various wines in the lounge
- Most popular food item: cheeseburger and fries
- Most popular ice cream: Sponge Bob Square Pants ice cream
- Most popular candy sold: Frozen Hershey chocolate bar
- Most popular beer: Longboard
- Most popular wine: chardonnay
- Largest one-day tab: \$160.00
- Most frequent patron(s) in Clarke's Lounge: **CLASSIFIED**

Bob takes great pride in what he does. We thank him for his long hours, his attention to detail, dedication to improvement and trying out new items and for mentoring young people ages 14 and up in the business world. "If you have time to lean you have time to clean." Bob truly cares about our council and the Club. Most importantly you are greeted with a warm smile and a "who's next?!?" from Mr. Clarke.

And by the way, revenue in 1998 for the facilities was \$28,000. In 2009 it was \$112,000. This year, 2010, revenue was \$134,000 which represents a 21% increase. Not bad for a NASCAR guy!! You Da Man, Bob.

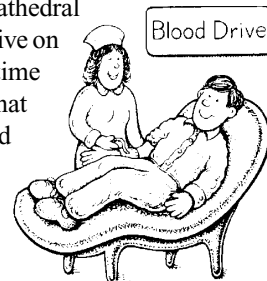

2010/2011 Dues: Members who are delinquent in their 2010 dues can expect my annual "one-two punch" and will receive back to back notices to garner their attention to EDW dues. I am currently working toward my goal of mailing the 2011 dues notices in early December, so please look for it in the mail.

As you know, Columbus Club dues will increase \$2.00 this year. Members will also be subject to a special assessment of \$6.00 per member to maintain Supreme's 'Culture of Life Fund' to further and promote the teachings of the Catholic Church with respect to matters affecting life, family, marriage and similar issues. Due to communication issues with Supreme, we failed to collect the assessment in 2010 and has been doubled to recoup the out of pocket payment we made. Considering the size of our Council, this assessment was a significant expense that must be passed on to the membership in order to maintain our financial health.

For purposes of your personal budget planning, most members' dues will increase by a total of \$8.00 this year. Dues for Regular Members dues will be \$126; Honorary Members dues will be \$70, Honorary Life Members dues will be \$50 (they are exempted from the Special Assessment and are required to pay Columbus Club dues only).

Thanksgiving Donations As the Thanksgiving season approaches, please remember to give generously so that we can continue to feed the needy. While a fair number of members unselfishly contribute to support the Thanksgiving Outreach, we need more support. Donations can be made by mailing them to my attention at the Council. Please make sure that you note "Thanksgiving" in the memo area of your checks. I want to thank everyone who gives to this important cause- you are the ones who truly make this happen!
