2011 MAC-ISA TREE CLIMBING CHAMPIONSHIP - APRIL 9TH

Thirty-five tree climbers from our chapter area (Maryland, Virginia, District of Columbia and West Virginia) will be competing to become the 2011 MAC-ISA Tree Climbing Champions. This year's contest will held on April 9, 2011 (rain date: April 10) at the Knights of Columbus in Arlington, VA. This beautiful site was used as the competition site in the 1980's.

The competition will feature events in foot locking, belayed speed climb, throw line, aerial rescue, and work climb. The top four men after the events will move onto the master's challenge. The men's champion is the winner of the master's challenge and will represent MAC-ISA at the 2011 ITCC. This year the ITCC will be held in Australia. The chapter pays the travel expenses to attend the ITCC for our champions. They both need to complete all five of the initial events in the allotted time to qualify.

This year's event will feature several educational and entertainment opportunities for both participants and spectators. Riverside Outfitters will host the recreational tree climb. It will offer people of all ages an opportunity to experience the thrill and challenge of tree climbing. In addition to seeing some impressive and exciting climbing, everyone at the event can see the latest tools and equipment offered by the exhibitors. This is a great chance to pick up that needed equipment and avoid the hassle of shipping. A food vendor will be offering lunch and snacks on Saturday, or you may bring a picnic.

Upon completion of the construction phase in late 2011, the two massive, Scottish-manufactured copper pot stills will spring to life and produce Virginia Single Malt whisky, a singular, local whisky that will age for no less than four years in freshly emptied bourbon barrels from nearby Kentucky distilleries.

While construction is being completed, VDC has worked with friends in Scotland to create Eades Double Malt whiskies. Representing the finest aspects of Scotland's three main distilling regions-- Highland, Speyside and Islay-- each bottle of Eades Double Malt whisky is comprised of two premium, mature single malts from its respective region. Each component single malt, aged for at least 10 years in bourbon or sherry casks, is matured for a second period in unique wine barrels from some of the finest wineries in the world, such as Chateau Lafite Bordeaux or Chateau D'Yquem Sauternes. The two single malts are then married together, and the resulting Double Malts are unique and complex while still retaining the best of what each region has to offer.
