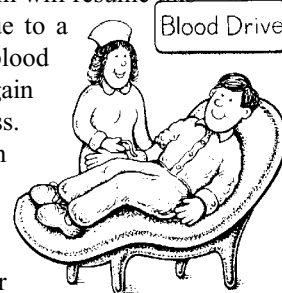

END NEWSPAPER DEATH NOTICES

For decades, EDW Council has announced the death of a member by publishing a notice in a daily newspaper (which, most recently, means The Washington Post). This action was intended to satisfy the requirement of By-Laws, Art. VIII, Sec. 1: "On the death of a member in good standing, the Council shall give notice to the members and, if time permits, shall request them to assemble and pay their respects" (Recall that EDW's notice usually duplicates details of wake and funeral service published by the family.)

I call for an end to such publications. The reason is "money." Last fall, The Washington Post nearly tripled the price of death notices. Each one now costs EDW about \$280. In the November 2009 to November 2010 period, 18 of our members died. To date in the present year, 12 have died. At the current rate for publication, EDW would have spent \$5,040 and \$3,360 to publish the traditional death notices. I submit that EDW has better uses for those monies in our many activities of charity and fellowship.

In the first Council meeting in June, I will rise during the call for "New Business" in order to initiate discussion on ending the practice of publishing death notices in a daily newspaper. Note the word "discussion." No motion. No vote. All will have the chance to air his views. Many may be unable to attend the June meeting. The discussion should be carried over as "Old Business" to the first meeting in July. In no event will any change be necessary in the By-Laws. The end of discussion should be a consensus to guide EDW's officers.

My proposed alternative to "give notice" (the wording of the By-Laws) is threefold: announce in EDW's webpage; place a temporarily announcement beside the book in the main lobby of the New Building; and place an announcement in the Council Home.


