MANAGERS CORNER

I would like to take this time to thank all those involved, far too many to mention, (except maybe for Jacob Willson who is always at the ready and is a constant example of good character, a chip off the ol' block) for their help in the July 3rd clean-up. The campus looked like a war zone. Branches and leaves were everywhere. Within hours our members with the help of gas powered leaf blowers and wheelbarrows managed to get the campus back to normal.

A special thanks to "Stan the Man" Rodriquez for coming to our aid so quickly and removing our downed trees. He is always there when you need him.

At 6:20pm on July 3, 2011 the Columbus Club Campus was hit with a microburst, I didn't even know what it was until then but now we all do.

For the record, a microburst is a much localized column of sinking air, producing damaging divergent and straight-line winds at the surface that are similar to, but not distinguishable from, tornadoes, which generally have convergent damage.

There are two types of microbursts: wet microbursts and dry microbursts. They go through three stages in their life cycle: The downburst, outburst and cushion stages. The scale and suddenness of a microburst makes it a great danger to aircraft due to the low-level windshear caused by its gust front, with several fatal crashes having been attributed to the phenomenon over the past several decades. A microburst often has high winds that can knock over fully grown trees. They usually last for a couple of seconds. By no means am I a meteorologist, but when in doubt...Google.

As a result of this microburst we lost power and our much used BBQ Pavilion forcing us to cancel our 4th of July BBQ, a great blow to all. Thank you for your understanding.

Hopefully, our BBQ Pavilion will be rebuilt in time for our Labor Day celebration.

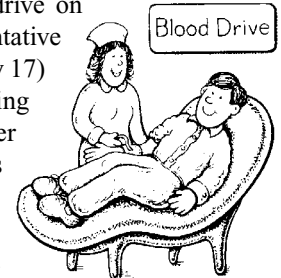
