When one considers all the upcoming holidays (and special days) Columbus Day, Halloween, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving and of course Christmas, it's really NOT TOO early to think about asking some close friends, relatives, etc., to join in making up a table, or two, to welcome in 2012 at EDW's New Year's Eve Gala.

For those who've not previously attended a New Year's Eve at EDW - this is truly a gala event. The evening starts with an "open-bar" social period with light hors d'oeuvres; followed by a 3-course dinner (salad, entree, dessert) w/choice of 2-3 entrees; the very popular "Jim Bowie Band" (5 pc. + vocalist) will be on stage from 9pm-at least 12:30am for your dancing & listening pleasure. Included in the low cost of \$95 per couple are beer,

40 DAYS FOR LIFE CAMPAIGN 2011

THIS FALL, from September 28 to November 6, our community is uniting with hundreds of other cities around the world for the largest and longest coordinated pro-life mobilization in history: the 40 Days for Life campaign. 2012 Dues I know this is only October and understand this might be a bit early to bring this up, but I am already beginning preparations to mail the 2012 dues notices. For those of members who have not yet paid for 2011, get ready for my “one-two punch”... What I mean by that is the 2012 notices come out in early December; however, I mail the 2011 delinquent bills in November. Please note that dues are payable on January 1st and remember that you will be required to pay an extra \$100 fee to join the pool if they are not paid by April 1st.

For purposes of your personal budget planning, dues will increase by \$2.00 in accordance with a resolution previously passed by the Columbus Club in 2003, but also be reduced by \$3.00, as our Special Assessment will be eliminated. Regular Members dues will be \$125 this year; Honorary Members dues will be \$72, Honorary Life Members dues will be \$52 (Columbus Club dues only).

Remember, if you don’t pay, you hurt EVERYONE in the Council, as we still must carry costs associated with delinquent members.

AMENDMENT TO THE BY-LAWS

WHEREAS, it is recognized that Article I, Section 3, of the By-Laws of the Council has set the initiation fee for new members at \$20;

WHEREAS, it is also recognized that the initiation fee has not been adjusted in over 25 years;

WHEREAS, it is further recognized that the Edward Douglass White Council is located in the Arlington and Falls Church, Virginia, area, which has been repeatedly described in the media as the wealthiest area of the United States;

WHEREAS, it is further recognized that the Knights of Columbus was founded by Father Michael McGivney with the express purpose of providing financial support to the widows and children of Roman Catholic men who died and left their families with little or no money to survive and that it is critically important to promote that vision and the viability of the Knights of Columbus;

BE IT RESOLVED that the initiation fee for all candidates who have reached their 26th birthday formally be amended to the amount of \$125 with the stipulation that such fees may be waived by the Financial Secretary upon the purchase of an annuity or insurance by a new member.
