## THE COLUMBUS CLUB'S CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS' SINCE 2006

In the spring of 2006, we launched our Capital Campaign Fundraising (CCF) and at the same time we started our capital improvement projects. Both were very ambitious projects and had very high goals and expectations. Both have been very successful!

It started with the Capital Improvements Phase - 1 in the spring of 2006. Not to long thereafter we went to Phase - 2, and to Phase - 3! Phase - 4 .....to be continued.....

So here are the results – from 2006 through 2013 we have completed capital improvements/acquired fixed assets of approximately \$942,000. Where did the funding come from? Well, we spent approximately \$206,000 from the Capital Campaign Fund (about \$5,000 still remains) and we only have \$141,000 of debt with Chain Bridge Bank (which will be paid off by November 2016). That leaves approximately \$595,000 that we funded out of our own cash flow. And we still have money in the bank.

Further, from 2003 through 2013, we paid back principal in the amount of \$459,476.

Together, these cash payments equal \$1,054,476 – that is a tremendous reinvestment of cash flow! What a tremendous success for EDW 2473 and the Columbus Club Inc. as we move into 2014. We have come a long way since the Main Hall renovation in 1999 and we will continue to do so.

To all the members who contributed to CCF, to all those members who have served on the Board of Directors since 1999, to all Past Grand Knight's and Deputy Grand Knight's since 1999, we want to thank you all for helping us achieve our goal of making our unique and beautiful campus a home to be proud of.

## **LONG-TERM CARE RESIDENCES**

John Kozar is a current member of the Arlington Commission on Long-term Care Residences and a Past Grand Knight at EDW, and, as such, he wants to share some information about long-term care issues and resources with EDW members.

**Here are some basic tips for you to consider as part of your planning for long-term care choices:**

- 1. Identify the facilities available in your area.**
- 2. Get as much information about them and Aging in Place as possible (web site and other searches) Stay involved within your community.**
- 3. Visit and tour the various facilities. Use planning and visit-checklists provided by AARP and others to help evaluate facilities.**
- 4. Contact your Area Agency on Aging to get started. (use phone book or Internet to find locations & phone numbers).**
- 5. Go to Medicare.gov and VA Department of Human Services and the VA Department of Social Services and the Virginia Ombudsman web sites to get information about current evaluations.**
- 6. If you have the financial resources, you can also contact eldercare attorneys and long-term care planning agencies that, for a fee, can assist you make a plan for your long-term care needs and also assist you with implementation of your plans.**
- 7. Start planning soon -- it is not easy to make good long-term care choices when faced with a crisis situation.**
