The Columbus Summer Camp began in 1999 with about 60 campers. Throughout the years the camp has grown exponentially. We have about 350 campers ranging in age from 5-13 that join our staff for fun and activities throughout the summer.

Even though there are many children that come to our camp we still have the feeling of being small. Each counselor has the chance to get to know each of their campers and help encourage them to be the best they can be.

Each session our camp has anywhere from 80-135 campers. Each camper is placed in a group of his or her own age which is led by at least one Lead Counselor and one Junior Counselor. It is the goal of the counselor to get to know each of their 18-22 campers during the session.

The Columbus Summer Camp prides itself on the relationship that it builds with the campers as well as staff members. It is important to us to create a safe and welcoming environment for our campers and their families.

Registrations for summer camp and the pool are now upon us. If you are an EDW family and have not previously enrolled your kids in our summer camp you will have the chance to enroll your child on February 1 at 4pm. Returning camp families can begin registering February 1 at 8am. For your friends and neighbors who are not EDW knights or haven't attended camp in the past they can register on February 2 at 8am.

Your council Dues must be paid in full before registering for camp or the pool. Also, if you plan to join the pool, council Dues need to be paid in full by April 1 or you will be charged an additional \$100 to join the pool. You can go to the council website and click on the blue box "Pay 2015 Dues Online!"

Veterans of summer camp registration do not need this warning, but those experiencing it for the first time this year most certainly do: Be logged on to your computer a few minutes before registration opens for your time period. Area camps sell out in minutes. Many camps do not give preferential registration to returning campers, we do. So please take advantage of it.

Please note that any non-knight trying to register prematurely or any knight trying to register for a non-knight family will have their transactions voided and will forfeit their registration and processing fees.

OUR NEIGHBORHOOD

Did you know that the Edward Douglass White Council is located within the Yorktown Civic Association? The Arlington County Board sponsors local civic associations in every neighborhood in the county to provide for 'grass-roots' representation and engagement on nearby matters. The geographical boundaries of the Yorktown Civic Association reach down to Lee Highway, west to Harrison Street, east to Old Dominion Road, and include Yorktown High School, Greenbrier Park, and our own Knights of Columbus campus. The Yorktown Civic Association (YCA) is non-partisan and membership is open to any household within the neighborhood boundaries. The YCA has bi-annual meetings and newsletters, and is led by an executive board; it has represented local neighbors to the county on matters such as the installation of traffic islands on Yorktown Boulevard in front of the high school, the location of speed bumps on neighborhood roads, and the economic development of the Lee Highway corridor in north Arlington, including the Garden City shopping complex (across from Wendy's on Lee Highway).

In the past, the YCA has advocated for specific neighborhood interests as the county renovated Greenbrier Park and the school board undertook significant renovation activities at Yorktown High School. The Civic Association also directs the selection of Neighborhood Conservation Projects for county work, including the installation of sidewalks and curbs along roads in the neighborhood. Several of our fellow Knights, including Mike Cantwell and Terry Costello, serve in leadership roles with the YCA. To this end, the Knights of Columbus supports policies that promote a Culture of Life and opposes legislative efforts that promote abortion, contraception, sterilization, cloning, the destruction of embryos, assisted suicide, euthanasia, unjust war, and the death penalty when there is an acceptable alternative.
