## KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS SERVES UP A HOLIDAY CELEBRATION

Volunteers began arriving at 4 a.m. on Thanksgiving morning, setting in motion preparations for the county's largest feast of the new holiday season.

Nearly 1,500 people were served traditional dinners of turkey, ham and the fixings by the Edward Douglass White Council of the Knights of Columbus, a Thanksgiving tradition that dates back to 1984.

By 1 p.m., as many Americans were sitting down to their own feasts (and about the same time as football began), a total of 1,016 dinners had been delivered to those in the community who might be alone for Thanksgiving, and preparations were well underway to serve another 400 or so in the organization's activities hall on Little Falls Road.

"We started with three turkeys (the first year) and we cooked 73 now," said John O'Neill Sr., who was helping to supervise the approximately 100 volunteers working to make the event a success.

"It gets bigger every year," said O'Neill.

Turkeys are purchased and roasted by council volunteers and others in the community. With the help of businesses such as Heidelberg Bakery and Outback Steakhouse, a complete meal of turkey, mashed potatoes, vegetables, stuffing, salad, dessert and beverage is provided to all who seek it.

They are all made to feel welcome by the Knights of Columbus, a Catholic service and fraternal organization.

"We're delighted to see as many guests as we have here in the room," said Sam Starr, who was coordinating the community meal event this year.

James Walthall was among those who began delivering prepared meals to those at homes, nursing facilities and other places late on Thanksgiving morning.

"They were all very happy, very appreciative," Walthall said of the 15 or so residents to whom he delivered meals. "It's an event that really warms your heart."

Three generations of Arlingtonians served as volunteers for the event – as drivers, servers, cooks and clean-up crews. The Knights of Columbus again this year had no problem recruiting volunteers from the local community, showing the holiday spirit was off to a good start.
