REQUEST FOR REPLACEMENT DD 214

I have received numerous requests at the Department of Defense for a replacement copy of an individual's DD 214, "Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty" which are maintained by the National Archives and Record Administration, NARA, at their National Personnel Records Center, in Saint Louis, MO. If you are a veteran or the next of kin of a deceased veteran, you may now use this web site "vetrecs.archives.gov" to order a copy of your military records. For all others, your request is best made using a Standard Form 180, "Request Pertaining to Military Records" which can be accessed from the following web site "http://www.archives.gov/st-louis/military-personnel/index.html." The SF 180 includes complete instructions for preparing and submitting requests.

I hope you find this information useful and are successful in acquiring a copy of your military records. The DD 214 is one document that will be necessary to bring to a funeral home director when that time comes. Unfortunately, many individuals have misplaced their DD 214 and are unable to locate it in their time of need.

Second Quarter Dues Notices Considering that the Knight Life is put together well in advance of its publication date, Second Quarter dues notices were (will be) mailed at the end of March. If you have not received your notice, you can pay your dues without the notice; annual dues are \$112 for Regular Members, \$57 for Honorary Members and \$42 for Honorary Life Members. Quarterly payments can be calculated by dividing these amounts by four. FIRST ANNUAL KING CAKE PARTY A PHENOMENAL SUCCESS!



LOOKING TO WORK AS A LIFEGUARD FOR THE 2007 POOL SEASON?

It is that time of year when our pool management company, US Aquatics, begins looking for lifeguards for the 2007 pool season and more importantly for our pool. If anyone is interested in applying for the position of a lifeguard you need to be certified. To get certified, please go to the following website and sign up for a class, this is the fastest way to do it. The website is: http://www.americanlifeguard.com/. Here is some more information about the lifeguard program:

"First Time Lifeguard Program Cost \$249.00 This training covers Lifeguarding, CPR/AED, First Aid and Oxygen Supplement, and Blood Pathogens. The new 2007 Lifeguard course offers two different certifications. One for shallow and deep water (you will want him to have the deep water one) and the other is for shallow water only. There is no cost difference and the training is very similar. The Shallow Water Lifeguard certification can be issued to individuals who are not strong swimmers, but can swim 50 yards instead of the new requirement of swimming 300 yards continuously for deep-water guards. They can even walk the brick, which the deep- water guards need to swim 20 yards with a 10lb weight. Now individuals who are not strong swimmers, but have no fear of the water can still be a Lifeguard at pools that do not have deep-water. If the student is unable to pass the more strenuous deep-water requirement at the time they originally take the training, but is successful in all other areas of training, they will receive a shallow water Lifeguarding certification. If at anytime they gain the ability to pass the more strenuous swim requirements they may upgrade to the deep water Lifeguarding at no additional cost. We are utilizing the newest American Red Cross training aids that were released January of 2007 for all our training. "

Please remember that anyone who is employed by US Aquatics and works at our pool, that they are employees of US Aquatics and that the Columbus Club of Arlington, Inc. does not have any involvement in this relationship.

LIBERTY JUMP TEAM

Honoring the Men and Women of WWII by Re-Creating their Heroics By FS Jerry Garren, PGK

When someone mentions World War II and the American involvement in a sentence, the Battle of Normandy comes to mind because so many troops stormed the beaches of Normandy on D-Day. Anticipating that the German military would expect some type of naval attack on the Allied front, American military officials deployed a little-known group to parachute behind enemy lines the night before D-Day to secure a safe landing for the many troops to follow. These brave men were members of the 517th Parachute Regimental Combat Team (PRCT) and also fought in Italy, Southern France and the Battle of the Bulge.

Unfortunately, the heroics of the 517th PRCT are not as well remembered as the heroics of others because they dissolved after 33 months. In this short time period, members of the PRCT tallied a Medal of Honor, six Distinguished Service Crosses, five Legions of Merit, 131 Silver Stars, 631 Bronze Stars, two Air Medals, four Soldier's Medals, seventeen French Croix De Guerre and 1,576 Purple Hearts during this relatively short period ...at the cost of 253 killed in action. (Source: Wikipedia)

On June 30, 2007, the Liberty Jump Team will perform a static line jump to recreate the heroics of the 517th PRCT at the Manassas Regional Airport in Manassas, Virginia. This event is scheduled to coincide with a reunion of the 517th Parachute Regimental Combat Team Veterans. The performance will unquestionably honor them in a very special way.

Now I know that you're asking yourself, "What the heck does this have to do with EDW?"

Well, last month, Teri Marrone (daughter of EDW Brother Mike Marrone) approached your Council Officers for assistance. Teri informed us that the team is comprised of current and former military parachutists with extensive experience. Believe it or not, these volunteers travel throughout the country to re-enact jumps from a privately owned C-47 largely at their own expense! The Jump Team anticipates a crowd of hundreds and will host a catered event for those who served in the 517th PRCT and other special guests.

The Jump Team is currently appealing to a number of civic organizations to help sponsor this once-in-a-lifetime event. After discussion, the Council Officers have unanimously agreed to ask EDW's membership to honor the 517th PRCT (as well as all of our brave Veterans) by donating to the organization to support this event (they've assured us that the Knights of Columbus would be prominently recognized). However, as the Financial Secretary, I am appealing to each of you to make a dedicated donation to the Council, which we will add to the amount of our Council's pledge. The Liberty Jump Team recently received their 501(c)3 status from the Internal Revenue Service and all donations are tax deductible. 


