LARGE DONATION TO CAPITAL CAMPAIGN FUND

In May of this year 2008, Jim Savarese received a call from Mary Lee Payton, the daughter of one our dearly departed EDW brothers, Leo Patrick Payton. She stated that her dad would have wanted her to contribute to the Capital Campaign. Jim said that would be great. We received a \$10,000 donation in memory of Leo Patrick Payton. Jim asked her if she could write something about her dad for the Knight Life. I want to thank Mary Lee for such a generous gift in memory of her dad and for a great story about him. What a great story it is. I wish I had met him!

Leo Patrick Payton

He was christened Leo, after the Pope, but he always preferred Patrick. Born October 6, 1903, he grew up in New Bedford, Massachusetts (of Moby Dick fame), part of a close and loving Irish family. Times were hard and he left high school in the 10th grade to move to New York, so there would be more food for the other kids and to try to make his fortune.

New York fascinated him. Jobs were hard to come by; more than once he saw the sign, "Help wanted. Irish need not apply." But he found jobs, including as a laborer, building Yankee Stadium, and when prohibition came in, he enjoyed a somewhat modest proportion of the speakeasy life. He knew actors, politicians, shoeshine boys, clergy, cops and jewel thieves and when he enlisted in the Army, many of them went to the pier to see him off.

He served in Panama, but contracted some nasty diseases there, was unable to continue in the service, and became a 100% disabled vet. While he was at Walter Reed recovering, he met my mother, Mary "Andy" Anderson, a civilian Registered Nurse, who was working there. One thing led to another and after seven years, they finally decided they would never be rich enough to get married so they did anyway.

A year later, he was diagnosed with cancer and was told that people sometimes lived 5 years with the disease. Thirty-four years later, having buried many of those doctors, he finally went Home to the Lord. In the meantime, he lived as fully and ferociously as his condition permitted. He had so many major surgeries that he used to say they were measuring him for a bottle at the Smithsonian. When folks asked how a doctor visit went, he would say, "It was great. I've been successfully repacked with sawdust so I won't cave in in embarrassing places." His humor carried him, and many others through difficult times.

He enjoyed life and politics—he knew and was known by presidents, astronauts, cardinals—and he never forgot regular people. He was self taught and could hold his own in a discussion with anyone. He was active in the Friendly Sons of St. Patrick, a member of the Military Order of the Carabao, attended Gridiron dinners and, of course, the Knights of Columbus, rising to 4th Degree. In April 1969 the First Degree class was named after him.

He loved God, his family, his country, and the Knights—especially the 4:30 club where the retirees would get together, whet their whistles, and tell each other tall tales. He had many a good time at EDW and I expect he and his buddies are having a good time in the next life.

ARLINGTON COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (CERT)

New CERT classes are scheduled to begin September 11 and 16. If you know of people who might be interested, have them drop a line to ArlingtonCERT@aol.com

The course concludes with a mock disaster/final exercise where team members put into practice all they've learned. Those who elect to become part of their neighborhood CERT are expected to acquire certain supplies, many of which should already be on hand in every household. A supply list is provided prior to the first CERT class.

Those who participate in Arlington County CERT training must be at least 18 years old (16 and up if accompanied by an adult), must reside and/or work in Arlington, and must be able to participate in all aspects of the training and final exercise, some of which may be physically demanding (e.g., lifting, carrying, crawling on the floor, and putting out fires). Those who wish to continue on to become a member of their neighborhood CERT will be required to complete advanced/continuing education courses available online and locally and may be required to pass a criminal background check.

EXPLAIN TO YOUR FAMILY WHY YOU DON'T GIVE BLOOD

The day you receive this Knight Life, explain to your wife and kids why you don't give blood.

Tell them how a big guy like you cannot take the pain of a little needle prick. Tell them you are so important that you cannot spare one hour every two months. Tell them you are so disorganized that you cannot fix a schedule eight weeks in advance.

In not-too-distant years past, EDW Council would produce well over 100 pints of blood every other month. July 2008 resulted in 34 pints. Some of those were from wives and teenage children. That means only about 30 EDW brothers stepped forward to donate. 30 out of more than 1000!

Many regular donors have gotten too old, or died, or take medicine that blocks donation. Members traveling abroad have visited places making them ineligible to donate. That still leaves hundred and hundreds of no-shows.

Why not mark your calendar for Sunday September 21st and then tell your family the many good reasons you GAVE blood: It didn't hurt much; it only took a little while; being organized lets you accomplish more; and you saved a life.

Also tell them—and remind yourself—that it is an act of charity, and that is what a Knight of Columbus does.

WHAT DOES IT COST TO OWN A HOME?

Today the costs of owning a home has sky rocketed. There are many options for paying the mortgage off, some which will cost you a lot more than others. For those starting out, you can access many different kinds of mortgages, and mortgage lengths up to 40 years! Just remember, although a longer amortization period will reduce your monthly payments, can drastically increase the interest costs you will pay.

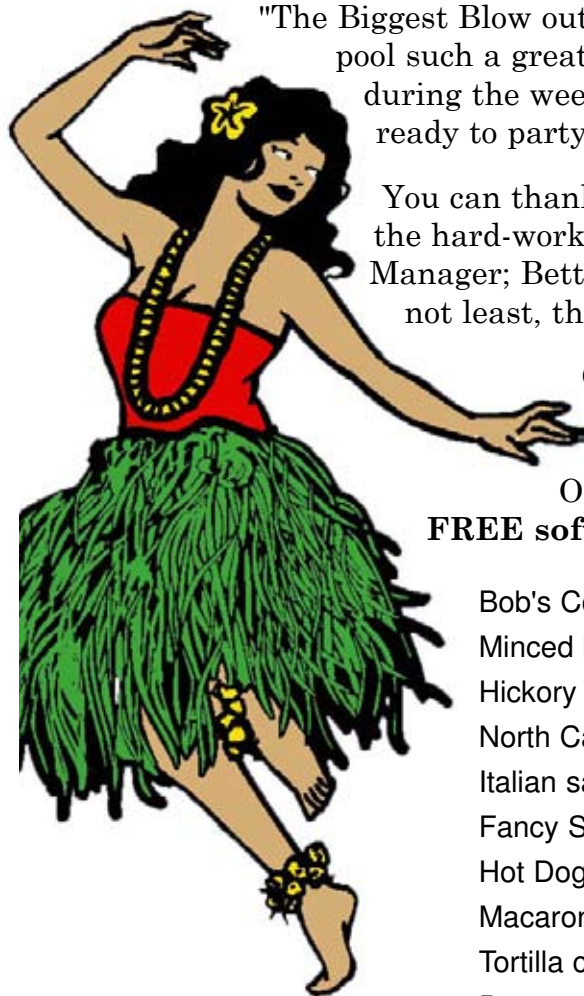
For this example let's use a \$400,000.00 mortgage with an interest of 6.25% and a thirty year amortization period. Starting in the year 2008 and utilizing the normal monthly payments of \$2,463.00, the mortgage would be paid off in the year 2038. Total cost of payments would equal \$886,633. If you went to bi-weekly payments of \$1,231.00, the mortgage would be paid off in 2032 at a cost of \$633,604. As you can see there is a difference of \$253,029 and 6 years between the options. Both had an initial cost of \$400,000.00 and did not include any payments for property taxes, homeowners insurance, etc.

One last fact, did you know that A&T is spending roughly \$250,000 at this site to install this cell tower! And it has to be done by December 31, 2008, no questions asked. Thank God for cell phones.

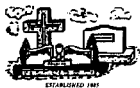
