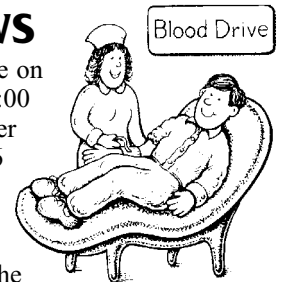

HOLY MACKERELS 4-0 IN CSL GOLD DIVISION

Mackerels Dedicate July 11 Meet and Award to Teammate Lost in February

The EDW Holy Mackerels swim team is off to another terrific season. With 230 enthusiastic swimmers and a 4-0 record-to-date in the Colonial Swim League's (CSL) Gold Division, fans can't help but exclaim, "Holy Mackerel!"

The Mackerels started their season at home with a 225-202 win against the Saratoga Stingrays, followed by more wins against the Sugarland Run Dolphins 275-162, the Chinquapin Wahoos 336-108 and the Glen Cove Pirates 406-36.

The undefeated Mackerels have also been busy breaking team records this season. In the June 27 meet against Sugarland Run, Nicolas Reeves broke two AKC teams records held since 1982 – in a time of 1 minute, 19.77 seconds in the boys age 11-12 100-yard individual medley and in 36.72 seconds in the boys age 11-12 50-yard backstroke. Hilary Stetekluh also broke her own team record, which she set in 2007, in the girls age 15-18 backstroke in a time of 30.81 seconds. And the boys mixed age relay broke the 200-yard freestyle relay set in 1997. The team of Daniel Mullen, Nicolas Reeves, Charlie Beirne and Daniel Thom swam a 2:01.27. At the CSL Relay Carnival on July 12, the Mackerels broke two other records. The age 13-14 mixed gender 200 free relay of Charlie Beirne, Philip Allen, Malia Rivera and Kathleen Butler destroyed the previous record set in 2004 by 5 seconds, with a time of 1:54.24. And Charlie Beirne, Philip Allen, Connor Hennessey-Niland and Allen Gibbs broke the age 13-14 boys 200 medley relay from 1988 with a time of 2:16.87.

In addition to winning meets and breaking records, this energetic group of swimmers aged 5-18 has also been busy having fun and building team spirit. At press time, the Mackerels had kicked off their Spirit Week, with activities such as themed-costume dressing, "school" spirit parties, water gun fights and a pancake breakfast planned.

As swim team families know, the friendship bonds made along the way are strong ones, and the July 11 home meet was a special and emotional one for the Holy Mackerels. The team dedicated the meet to longtime team member and junior coach Peter Samp. Samp died unexpectedly in February of a brain condition. July 11 would have been his 19th birthday. Just prior to the start of the July 11 meet, the AKC Board of Directors and coaches announced the new Peter Samp Award at a ceremony including Peter's family. The Peter Samp Award will be given to an outstanding swimmer who is committed to the team and is driven to succeed in and out of the pool.

"Peter was always the first one in the water for practice and often swam double practices," recalled AKC Head Coach Caroline Heeter. "He worked hard and inspired others to work harder. He knew every team record by heart and helped me strategize the best way to determine our relays. He was determined, humble, quietly inspirational, and a good friend."

The Holy Mackerels have remembered Samp in different ways throughout the season: with an orange flag in the backstroke flags, in prayer before each "A" meet, with a key chain bearing his name hooked to the lane line in the pool so that he's "in the water" with the team, and via this season's team t-shirt, which was inspired by Samp's favorite football team, the Pittsburgh Steelers.

We keep Peter and his family in our prayers, along with all the Holy Mackerels and their families for the remainder of the swim season.
