If you wish to contribute to earthquake relief via EDW you can send a check to the Financial Secretary with a note in the memo line mentioning earthquake relief.

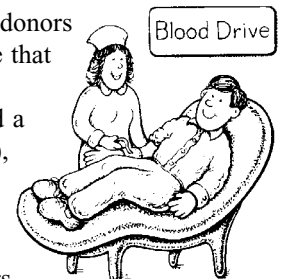

As folklore has it "The intent of the founding Fathers, who bought this property at 3pm on Friday, August 11<sup>th</sup> 1951, was to have a permanent Council Home (CH) where KOC families and friends could come and gather, enjoy a COLD soda or adult beverage, maybe a hot meal, read books, play cards and board games, and most importantly be surrounded by a Catholic atmosphere." It was never intended to be a "Profit Center"! How could it be when beers go for \$2.50 and a hot packed cheese steak sub is \$6.00 (twice the size of "Jerry's Subs")!

However, since we have been tracking the CH Income more closely since 2004, it has become a more popular place for dining and beverages. Remember the old days - "You have anything to eat? No we are out of food, you want a beer?"

John O'Neil Jr. and Scotty have been doing a great job in offering consistently good food. From John's Sat. Steak Night, Tues. Burger Night, to Friday's Fried Fish, or steamed shrimp, or crab legs - to Scotty's Wednesday Taco Night, Thursday Spaghetti Night, to the Sat. famous "Scotty Subs" from noon to 5pm. From Knee Pads, double flush chili, to just a good old grilled cheese, the CH has it and all the time. And the front two rooms are designated "non smoking" with plenty of tables, chairs, sofas and two huge flat screen TVs. John has done a great job in being our Bar Manager and he has recruited a great staff too! The proof is now there as the John's pride and determination to make this place a success has paid off. Let's also thank Nanette for helping out John and for putting up with him.

Here are some facts: Total CH revenue 2005 - \$121,187, vs. 2009 - \$152,264. Total Food Sales 2005 - \$27,048 vs. 2009 - \$42,873. Total Beer Sales 2005 - \$81,586, 2007 - \$74,155 vs. 2009 - \$96,566. And the COG'S and expenses have been kept in check!

What I want to focus on is the Total Income. As you can see from the above, the CH, because it is a great place to now come and eat and drink, it has once again become a destination point.

Lastly, we want to thank all the other staff and Red Coats, thank you too!

"Build it and they will come!" And if we make a little profit, that's OK too.

## ARE THE FACILITIES OF COLUMBUS CLUB OF ARLINGTON INC. / KOC PROPERLY INSURED FOR HAZARD AND LIABILITY COVERAGE?

That question comes up more times than you might think at our board meetings and from members. We have been working with the same insurance professional, Scott Wallace of Wallace and Wallace, since 2007. In 2009, Scott recommended that we obtain an insurance appraisal for our buildings and the BOD gave the go ahead at a cost of \$1,950. Some questioned why an "insurance appraisal? A very fair question!

First, insurance appraisals can keep insurance premiums down. Since it is the BOD's responsibility for the risk management of a

real estate portfolio and ensuring proper insurance coverage for those assets, we needed an up-to-date insurance appraisal.

**WHAT IS AN INSURANCE APPRAISAL?** An insurance appraisal is an independent, supportable opinion of replacement cost that serves to establish insurance values and helps expedite claims in the event of a partial or total loss. Replacement cost is defined as the amount of money required to replace the entire property at one time, with a building having utility equivalent to the building being appraised, using modern materials and current standards, design and layout, and most importantly - building code changes.

**WHY GET AN INSURANCE APPRAISAL?** Our insurance premium is a significant line item in our operating budget, about \$46,000. Insurance agents and brokers base their competitive bids to insure the property in part on the insurable value of the property. Sound business judgment suggests the necessity to base each bid on the same level of property value. An initial and periodic independent insurance appraisal confirms the appropriate amount of insurance.

A property owner may also lose without an appraisal because:

1) Trending the insurance values up each year may result in inflated replacement property values over time, which means you're paying too much in premiums. Building material and labor rates fluctuate from year to year.

2) Conversely, if your insurance values are too low, you may be unknowingly self-insuring, which, in the event of a loss, would have disastrous consequences, requiring property owners to pay a portion of the cost to rebuild.

#### **BENEFIT OF AN INSURANCE APPRAISAL**

Our benefit is that we now have documented support in the event of a partial or total loss. An independent, supportable insurance appraisal is key to expediting claims with insurers. The real value to us is that we are paying the proper amount of insurance premiums, neither too much nor too little.

#### **GET UPDATES REGULARLY**

The appraiser will update our appraisal annually at a no cost. An insurance appraisal estimates replacement costs as of a specific date. Economical updates (generally only a fraction of the cost of the original appraisal) help to ensure the accuracy of the property values. Changes in replacement costs can result from many factors, including technological advancements in product design, construction methods and materials. Labor rates, a significant factor in determining replacement costs, will fluctuate over time, due to supply and demand factors.

The independent insurance appraisal helps the BOD fulfill their fiduciary responsibility by protecting the property from partial or total losses with appropriate coverage, thus saving money over the long run.

Just an update on what we have done since 2007:

Property increased by \$650,000, Sexual Molestation limit increased by \$700,000, Liquor liability limit increased by \$10,000,000, and Umbrella limit increased by \$5,000,000.

## **NEWS FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS**

The news release below was forwarded by the State Council to various state and local officers. It is being printed in this edition of Knight Life as it will be of interest to many of our EDW brother knights.

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE – January 7, 2010

VA Statement about 2010 Benefits and Programs

WASHINGTON – The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) wants to inform Veterans and **other beneficiaries** of the following changes that will take effect in 2010:

**VA will Freeze Increase in Prescription Copayments:** Any increase in Veterans out-of-pocket payments for pharmaceuticals will be delayed until June 30, 2010. This means the department will delay a scheduled \$1 increase – to \$9 – in the copayments facing Veterans for each 30-day supply of medicine for the treatment of conditions not related to military service. During this period, VA will also keep \$960 as the maximum, annual out-of-pocket payments for pharmaceuticals for non-service-related conditions. The \$960 cap will not apply to Veterans in priority groups seven and eight. The yearly maximum out-of-pocket payment was scheduled to increase to \$1,080. There are no copayments associated with the treatment of conditions related to military service.

**VA will Distribute Insurance Dividends:** Approximately 900,000 Veterans are in line to share \$286.4 million in annual insurance dividends during 2010. VA operates one of the nation's largest life insurance programs, providing more than \$1 Trillion in coverage to seven million servicemembers, Veterans, and family members. These payments will be made to insurance policy holders on the anniversary date of their policies. Payments will be sent automatically through different payment plans and the amounts will vary based on the age of the Veteran, the type of insurance, and the length of time the policy has been in place. Consistent with private mutual insurance company practice, the VA is returning a portion of premium payments back to policyholders because the agency had strong financial results.

**No Adjustment in COLA for Disability Compensation + Pension Benefits:**

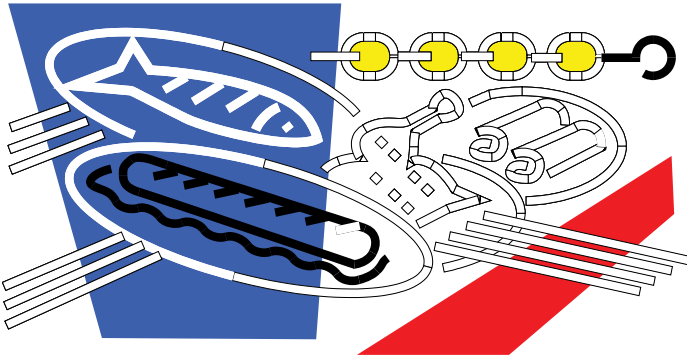
As a result of negative inflation and the consumer price index going down over the past year the Social Security Administration has announced there will be no COLA this year for Social Security recipients. Under federal law VA's COLAs cannot exceed the Social Security COLAs. Therefore, VA is barred from making a COLA increase for recipients of its benefits.

VA provides compensation and pension benefits to over 3.8 million Veterans and other beneficiaries. Presently, the basic monthly rate of compensation paid to Veterans ranges from \$123 to \$2,673. Annual income limits for disability pension begin at \$11,830 for a Veteran without dependents and increase for Veterans who have dependents, who are housebound, or who need regular aid and attendance.
